Nicotine Lozenge 2 mg 4 mg	1st cig. < 30 min after waking: 4 mg 1st cig. > 30 min after waking: 2 mg 1 piece every 1 to 2 hours	12 weeks	<ul> <li>Do not eat or drink 15 min before use</li> <li>One lozenge at a time</li> <li>Limit to 20 in 24 hrs</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Heartburn</li> <li>Local irritation of mouth and throat</li> <li>Coughing</li> <li>Hiccups</li> </ul>
